



Concerning:
ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

I am notifying you that Lancashire Police, Lancashire Fire and Rescue Service together with housing associations in your area have formed a partnership to address the problems of anti-social behaviour over the Bonfire night and Halloween period.

Our concerns are that some young people face all sorts of pressure to follow friends who may be involved in this type of disorder. Media images often glorify anti-social type of activity and make it more acceptable to young people. However, the reality is that this type of behaviour can be highly distressing to other people in your community and can lead to complaints to the police being made.

The partnership will be looking for young people who misuse fireworks, alcohol, throw eggs/flour at any persons or property and cause nuisance within the community. There will be extra Police presence on the streets to prevent such incidents taking place and to make the community feel safe and reassured during this period.

Whilst we want your child to enjoy this time of year we are seeking your assistance and support in dealing with this matter and ask you to advise your child to refrain from any behaviour that could be deemed as unruly.
